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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Sessions catered to providers ○ Panel session on how to get funding for specific school needs ○ Social determinants of health session ○ Medicaid 101 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Many school nurses do not know that children with private health insurance can also avail of services from Medicaid. (e.g., eye exams). ▪ Many nurses and parents of children with special needs do not understand the value of having Medicaid/what resources are available to them ○ Continue to encourage more speakers to present case studies/examples from their school districts. ○ Even though attendance numbers are rising for the ISHN Conference there is still an issue with some school professionals who have access to scholarships not attending the conference ● CKF Local Coalition Issues with Schools <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It would be beneficial to have a more active link between CKF-IN Local Coalitions and Schools – especially with the nurses. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Increasing partnerships with schools enhances compliance with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). ▪ Establish referral relationships with school health champions. ○ We need to increase the outside teamwork/partnerships with schools.
