Indiana 211 mission

 To improve quality of life for Hoosiers by connecting people to health and human service resources through highly skilled Navigators, continuous community collaboration and a robust community database, and technological innovations.

What is 211?

- Indiana 211 is a free service that connects Hoosiers with help and answers from thousands of health and human service agencies and resources right in their local communities—quickly, easily and confidentially.
- There are no eligibility requirements, income standards nor any other rules. Anyone can call 2-1-1.

Indiana 211 fast facts

- Indiana 211 serves all residents of Indiana
- The average 2-1-1 call is 10 minutes long
- In 2024, Indiana 211 received over 170,000 calls and provided over 560,000 referrals
- Average of 14,200 calls each month, serving over 9,500 individual callers each month
- Greatest needs are housing, utility assistance and food

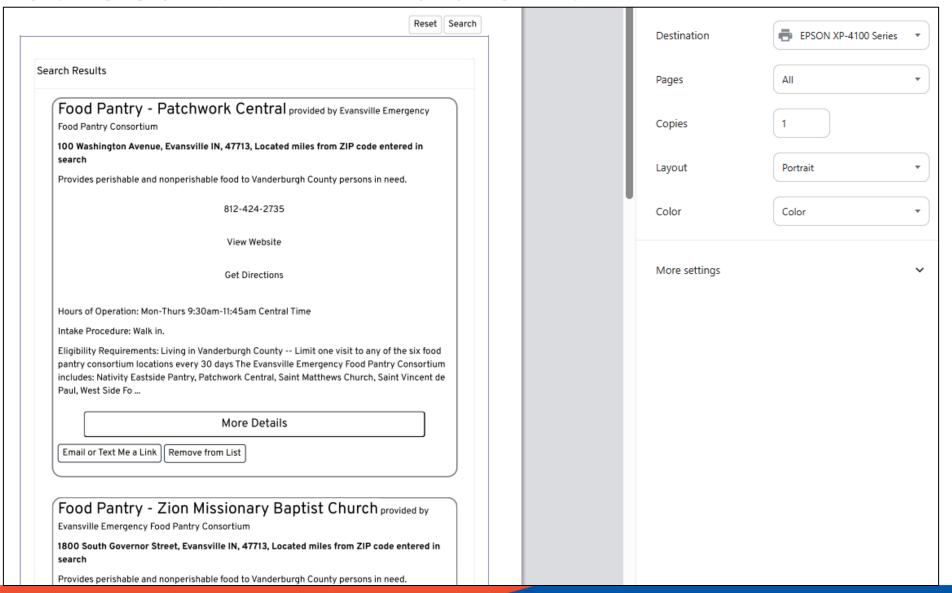

Who should call 2-1-1?

Any Hoosier looking for services can call Indiana 211, including:

- Person who needs services
- Medical professional
- Advocate
- School counselors, social workers
- School personnel
- Neighbor, friend
- Family member

A caller does not need to be in crisis to call 2-1-1

What to Expect When Calling 2-1-1

Indiana 211 community navigators

- Connectors to community resources
- We have 57 community navigators who receive three weeks of training
- Access to connect with interpreters for over 240 languages
- Ask a series of Social Determinants of Health questions to understand where a person is at the time of the call
- Much more than a phone call
 - Advocate for callers with warm transfers
 - Follow up with callers



Lines of service

Childcare – Childcare Development Fund

• Provides statewide CCDF referrals and answers basic questions regarding CCDF application status.

Childcare - Facility Complaints

• Accepts and investigates complaints/incident reports related to any Indiana childcare provider.

Childcare - Facility Referrals

• Provides statewide childcare referrals.

Childcare - Spanish

• Provides statewide childcare referrals to Spanish-speaking clients.

DMHA – Lyft

• Provides rides to and from verified substance use disorder treatment centers.



Lines of service (continued)

DMHA - Substance Use Disorder Information Helpline

• Completes an in-depth assessment and provides referrals to SUD treatment centers.

DMHA - Peer Mental Health, Substance Use, and Recovery Services

• Connects Hoosiers with mental health and substance use disorders to treatment and recovery supports through Certified Peer Recovery coaches.

IDOH - Immunization Helpline

• Statewide information line that answers questions and addresses concerns related to COVID-19, Flu, Monkeypox, and other communicable diseases.

IHCDA - EAP Application Assistance

• Completes applications for the statewide Energy Assistance Program.

- 1. What is your employment status?
- 2. What is your current yearly household income?
- 3. What is the highest level of education you have completed?
- 4. What is your living situation today?
- 5. In the past 12 months, has the electric, gas, oil or water company threatened to shut off services in your home?
- 6. Within the past 12 months, have you worried that your food would run out before you could get more?
- 7. Do you receive SNAP benefits?
- 8. In the past 12 months, has a lack of transportation kept you from medical appointments, meetings, work, or from getting things you need for daily living?
- 9. Do you currently have health insurance?
- 10. Does anyone, including family, ever insult or talk down to you?

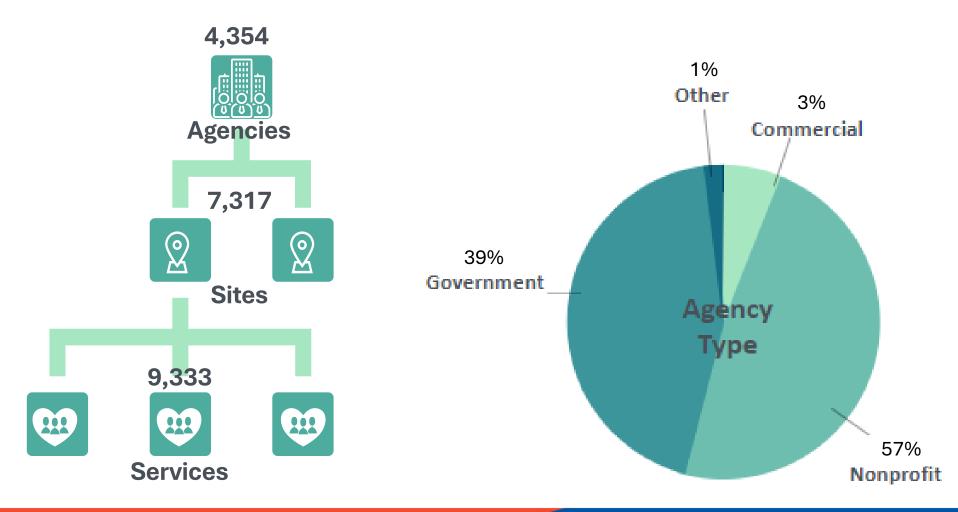

- Community collaborations/coalitions

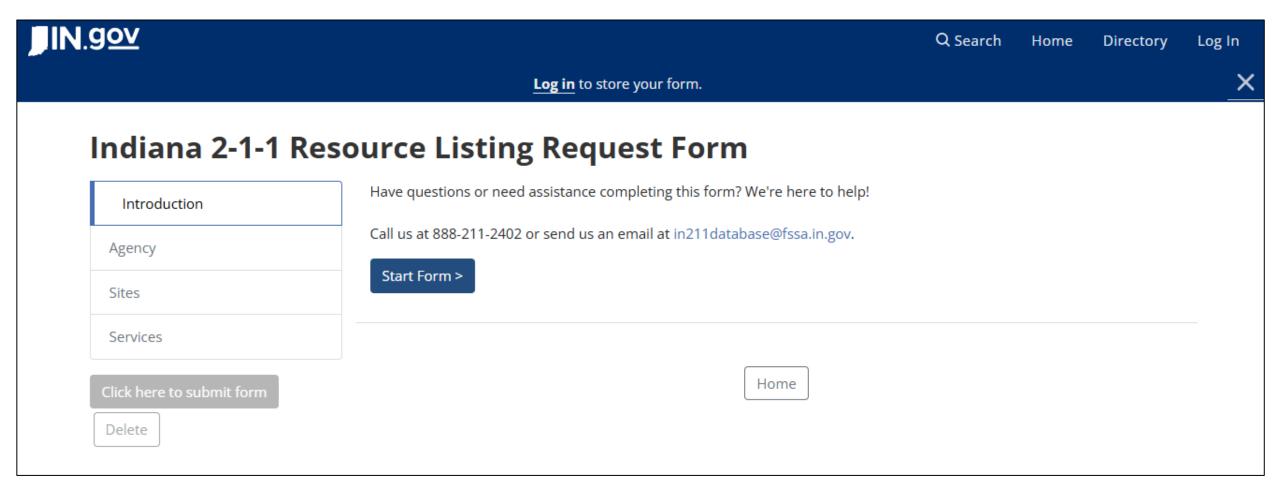
We will exclude:

- Programs that are for members only

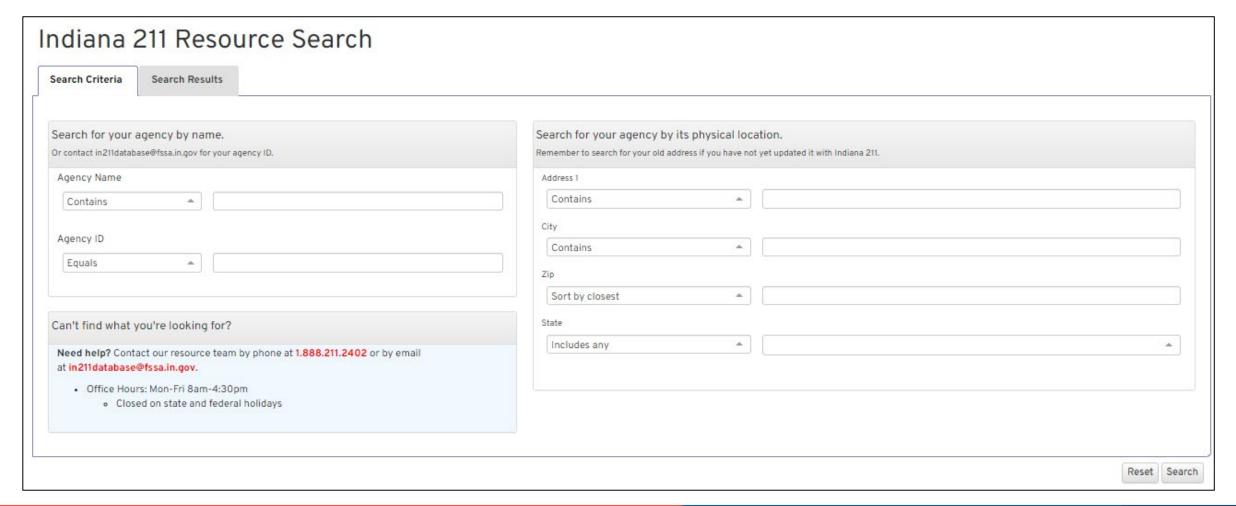
We will consider:

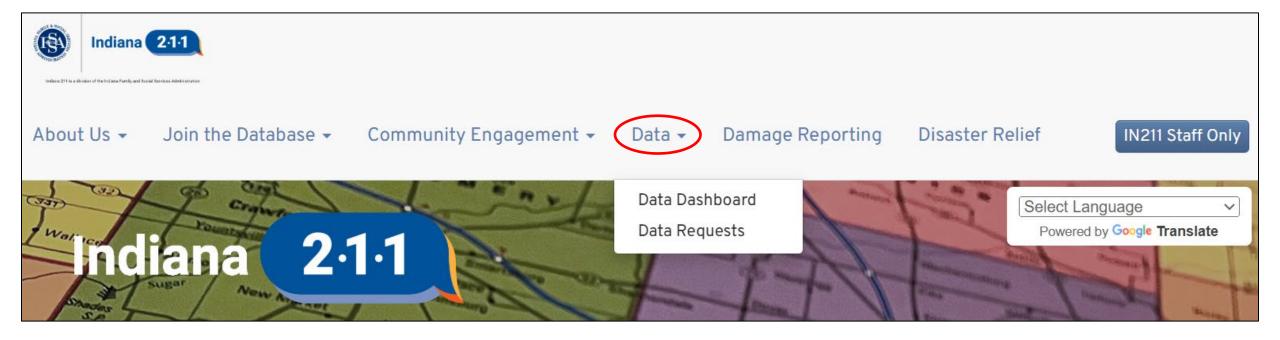

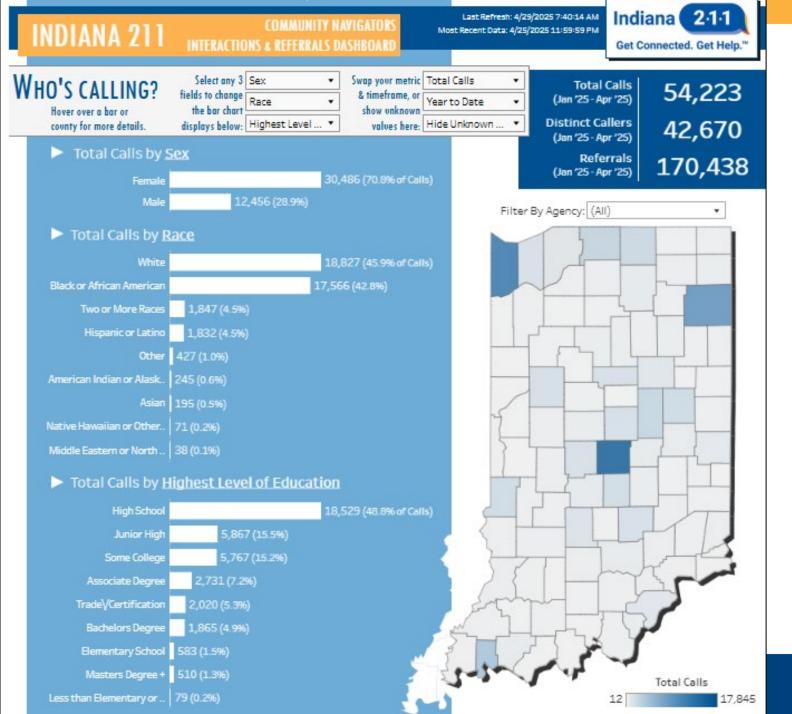

Indiana 211 data dashboard



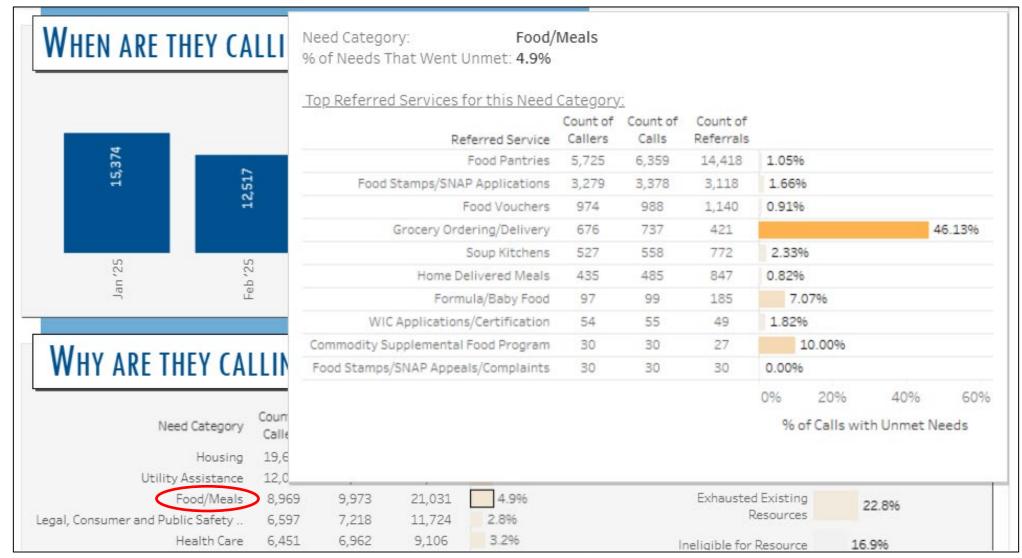
Indiana 211 interaction dashboard

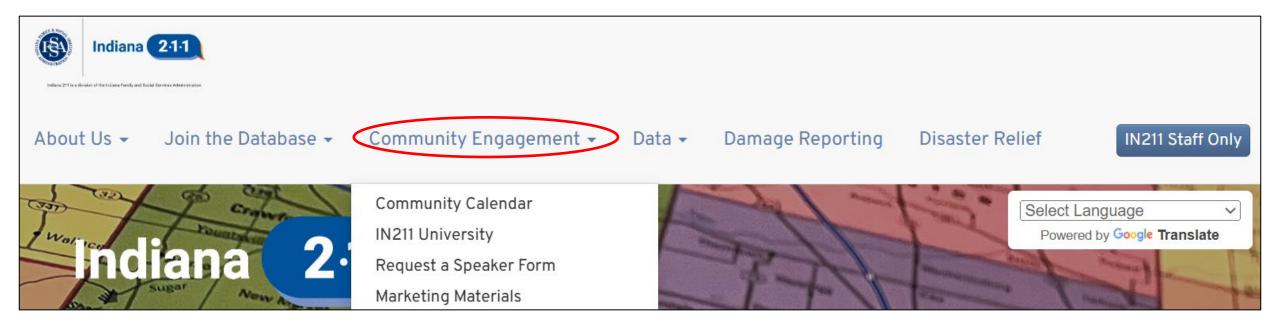

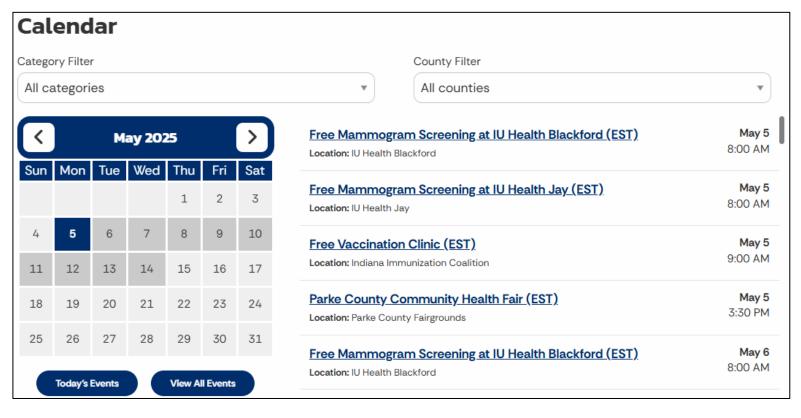

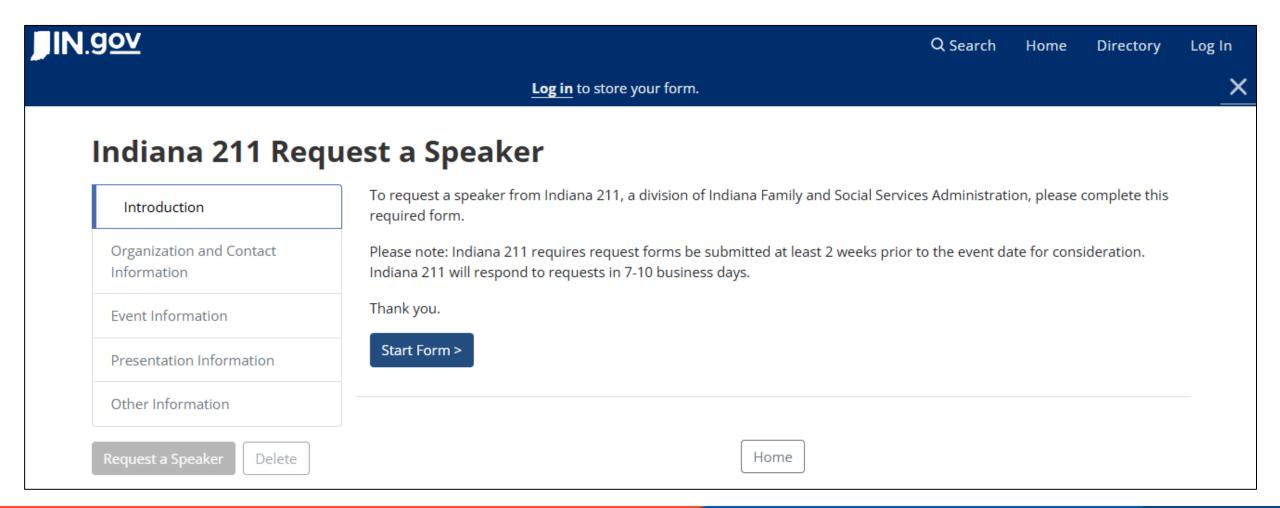
