








What is Vape Waste?

Vapes have multiple waste streams:

Plastic waste

Vape casings and cartridges

Electronic waste

- Circuitry
- Atomizer
- Sensors

Hazardous waste

- Nicotine and nicotine salts
- Toxic metals
- Lithium-ion batteries (universal waste)



How is Vape Waste Affecting Schools?

Schools are accumulating vapes for various reasons.

- Confiscating from students
- Voluntary, anonymous surrendering
- Finding on school grounds

Other issues:

- Plumbing
- Fires

Tobacco Considerations

- Lifespan of vapes
 - Most reusable vapes last 6-8 months
 - Disposable vapes are single use
- Complications with disposable vapes
 - Most common type of vape used by youth
 - Most users discard them in the trash
 - Batteries within disposables can not be easily separated
- Complications with other substances
 - Cannabis & THC
 - Other substances

Other Local Examples



Allen County Health Department: Vape Waste Disposal Program in Schools

- Partnership with local fire department and local department of environmental management
- Started because of a lithium-ion battery fire from a vape in a local school
- Issues with schools affording the necessary supplies and services for safer handling, storage, and disposal
- Pilot program started in Fall 2024: Middle and high schools received a kit of two large buckets with sand and safety bags along with instructions on how to safely handle and store the vapes and when they need to be transported to recycling facility to be disposed.
- School Resource Officer transports the bucket of vapes to the recycling center
- Tracking process was set up at the recycling center to collect data from each school that drops off vapes
- Recycling center sends Allen County Health Department an invoice and report on what was dropped off
- Funding: Allen County Health Department covered the cost with Health First Indiana funds
- Future: Plan to continue this in the next school year if funds allow

Tobacco Free Lake County Indiana: Vape Waste Collection Program in Schools

- School administrators were not aware that vapes were hazardous or how to safely handle them
- Realized there was no unified and consistent process for counties or municipalities on collecting, storing, or disposing of vapes
- Had conversations with local solid waste management and a hazardous waste company to seek out a strategy
- Original concern around accepting disposable vapes that could lead to issues dismantling the vape
- Received approval from hazardous waste company on an appropriate collection container
- In partnership with Lake County's SAFE Coalition, they created a vape disposal safe handling guide
- Complete kit includes vape disposal box, gloves, plastic bags, guide, agreement form, and additional resources



Prepared and distributed **50** vape disposal boxes to schools, organizations, and law enforcement.


